I feel that there has been expressed a need for a newsletter (or something) for Canadians working in the field of electro-acoustic music. Many other people seem to feel the same way, but it (and they) never quite manage to get off the ground.

At a recent meeting of an ad-hoc group of composers in Toronto, David Keane (Kingston / Toronto) gave a brief history of this area. Alcides Lanza (Montréal) expressed the common need for a channel of communication. Jean Piché (Vancouver) entered into a discussion about a national association of some kind. Jim Montgomery (Toronto) expressed a need for communications. I, Kevin Austin (Montréal) said that I would start a newsletter that could be the forum for national discussions on this and other matters.

However, first things first. I need to be able to reach people. I have a mailing list of about 60 people in Canada who are involved in the field. This appears to be between 15% and 25% of the people, depending upon your sources.

I need names and addresses. Not just yours (since you got this), but those of others who are not getting this.

PLEASE SEND ME THIS INFORMATION, OR ELSE NOTHING WILL HAPPEN. I need this soon, as I wish to send out letter number minus one in November, and letter number zero in mid-December.

The topics of the newsletter are open to discussion, but most likely will include reports on local / regional / national / international activities of concern and/or interest to some/many/all readers.

Electro-acoustic Music and Fibre Sculpture

The Music Department of the Faculty of Fine Arts of Concordia University, and the Concordia Electro-acoustic Composers' Group, will produce a three day fibre sculpture in the trees of the Loyola Campus, during its three day, mini-series of electro-acoustic music concerts entitled,

" SONIC STRANDS "

These three out-of-doors concerts will feature members of the C.E.C.G. in live electro-acoustic performance in compositions by members of the group, and works on tape by other composers, including Denis Lorrain, Yves Daoust, Alain Thibault, David Keane, Jean Séguin, John Celona, Steve Fai and Marcelles Deschênes, among others.

During the concerts, a "fibrous web", over 5,000 ft² (500 m²), will be woven in the trees of the Grove, (behind the main buildings), of the Loyola Campus of Concordia University. Donations of threads, strings and things are invited. Public participation is encouraged.

There will be a hibachi to cook on, and free apples. Dress for the weather; in case of rain, that day's concert will be cancelled.

Le Département de musique de la Faculté des beaux-arts de l'Université Concordia et le groupe électro-acoustique de Concordia (G.E.C.) réaliseront une sculpture en fibres dans les arbres du campus Loyola à l'occasion d'un concert de musique électro-acoustique qui se déroulera trois jours durant sous le titre

" TOILES SONORES "

First, an apology for sending this out as a generalized memo, but I wish to contact as many people as possible, and my normal way of individual personal letters would take a little too long.

I will be in Toronto this weekend and will try to speak with as many composers and interested people as possible about putting out a newsletter.

There have been several attempts in the past that have got as far as one or two issues, and for a variety of reasons seem to have had troubles.

I have access, through the University, to funds for printing, assembling and (précis) translation of materials.


If I can get updated addresses, I could even provide this most important information.
